Dear Mr. Lindemuler:

Thank you for notifying us that the types ZJ U.D. and ZJP arresters are no longer manufactured. In accordance with your request, the Committee voided the acceptance of the ZJ U.D. and ZJP arresters and removed them from the List of Materials.

The Committee found your ZRP, heavy duty, distribution polymer-housed surge arresters to be acceptable on a conditional basis. The ZRP, heavy duty, distribution polymer-housed surge arresters will appear on page U ae(2) of the Rural Utilities Service (RUS) Conditional List of Materials as follows:
